Woe to those who devise wickedness and work evil upon their beds! When the morning dawns, they perform it, because it is in the power of their hand. They covet fields, and seize them; and houses, and take them away; they oppress a man and his house, a man and his inheritance. Therefore thus says the LORD: Behold, against this family I am devising evil, from which you cannot remove your necks; and you shall not walk haughtily, for it will be an evil time. In that day they shall take up a taunt song against you, and wail with bitter lamentation, and say, "We are utterly ruined; he changes the portion of my people; how he removes it from me! Among our captors he divides our fields." Therefore you will have none to cast the line by lot in the assembly of the LORD. The Reader concludes The Word of the Lord.

- 12 Rise up, O LORD; lift up your hand, O God; * do not forget the afflicted.
- Why should the wicked revile God? *
 why should they say in their heard, "You do not care"?
- 14 Surely, you behold trouble and misery; * you see it and take it into your own hand.
- 15 The helpless commit themselves to you, * for you are the helper of orphans.
- 16 Break the power of the wicked and evil: * search out their wickedness until you find none.

- 17 The LORD is King for ever and ever; * the ungodly shall perish from his land.
- 18 The LORD will hear the desire of the humble; * you will strengthen their heart and your ears shall hear;
- 19 To give justice to the orphan and oppressed, * so that mere mortals may strike terror no more.
